

New Special Rule for Turkey Season

At its regular April Board meeting on April 11, 2023 Directors passed the following special rule:

Supplemental feeding of wildlife will not be allowed on any property owned or leased by Nettleton Fox Hunting and Fishing Association between the dates of March 1 and April 30 each year.



Over the months leading up to turkey season several instances of what would be considered illegal baiting were found. Members of the MDWFP advised Directors on this matter. The rule was passed to protect turkeys from baiting situations, to allow turkey hunters to confidently hunt anywhere on Club property without worrying about hunting over bait that the Hunter didn't know was there, to allow turkeys to move and be hunted in a natural setting, and early spring vegetation providing plenty of food for wildlife during this time period.

Club members urged to be courteous



A recent letter to all shareholders from Club President, Bobby Sprayberry urged members and families to help all members enjoy the Club by being courteous and respectful of others. Respecting other properties such as tree stands and gem cameras, controlling pets and animals brought to the Club, and paying attention to safety of others was asked of all who use the Club.
